1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

School Learning Objective - We have identified the area we would like to concentrate our efforts in, in order to best improve our school. School Board Report and Update School/Building – District-Wide Director of Special Education, Pupil and Learning Services -Amanda Jones November 13, 2018

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- Building level assessment teams and administrators have continued to conduct trainings with building level staff on the use and administration of FastBridge universal screenings.
- It has been determined that the elementary schools will utilize the Social/Emotional screener portion of FastBridge, in addition to the academic screening. This tool consists of a a teacher-only rating system of social-emotional/behaviors for students in grades Kindergarten and First grade, and then a teacher rating scale as well as a student (self) rating scale for grades two through twelve.
 - After SAEBRS (teacher) and mySAEBRS (student) are completed, that data will be reviewed by administration and the assessment team to analyze and determine how to utilize the data that is found for any identified at-risk students.
- The October 26th in-service of Social Emotional Learning went extremely well, and was well received by staff. Many members of the SEL committee received positive feedback from multiple staff members regarding the importance of the information, as well as the manner of delivery.

- The Pupil Services team is excited to announce that it has been approved for the SBIRT grant. SBIRT (Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment), is an evidence-based practice used to identify, reduce, and prevent problematic use, abuse, and dependence on alcohol and illicit drugs, including substance abuse. The middle/high school staff consisting of Kay Leigh Sockrider (psychologist), Renee Cookstrom (Counselor), and Nick Jones (Associate Principal) will receive two days of intensive training (free) as well as \$1,800.00 upon completion of the grant requirements at the end of the 2018/19 school year. This is one way in which the pupil service department hopes to continue to meet the needs of students within the multi-level system of support framework, especially for at-risk youth and those struggling with mental health.
