- Teachers are being trained in Lucy Calkins Pre-assessment of On-Demand Writing Prompts as well as further review of how we administer Running Records.
- Teachers are administering and scoring their own class on the AIMSweb exam this

- MAP and AIMSweb We are on our second round of testing using the two screeners to help us decide where students are academically. It takes us approximately a week to administer each screener for the entire school. This information is used to differentiate instruction for each student. Teachers then meet to collaborate and discuss this information along with information gathered from other progress monitoring tools. These collaboration opportunities are key to accurate differentiation.
