# School Board Report and Update School/Building – Palmyra-Eagle High/Middle School Principal – Kari Timm February 9, 2016

#### 1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

In-service on January 22nd was a very valuable training on Google Classroom. Teachers were able to have about 2 hours of inservice on how to use google classroom and then over an hour of time to work and get guidance on getting at least one classroom set up. We are asking teachers to use Google Classroom with at least one class or course for the rest of 2nd semester with the plan to use it for all classes/courses next year.

We are working on preparation for all three state assessments that will be giving 7-12 this year. I have gone to training or watched webinars for ACT Aspire and the forward exam and we will begin prep for those in March closer to the opening of the testing window. Letters have gone home to all high school grade levels indicating how they will be affected during the ACT and ACT workkeys on March 1st and 2nd. On the 1st we have alternate activities planned off site for the 9th and 10th graders and are giving the 12th graders the day for college visits, scholarship applications, job applications or other things in preparation for graduation. We will run a normal day of school on the 2nd and test juniors in the cafeteria in a large group. This allows us to give the juniors a good testing environment while still having school for the other students.

# School Board Report and Update School/Building –District-Wide Director of Special Education, Pupil and Learning Services Amanda Jones February 9, 2016

#### 1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- Dynamic Learning Map (alternative assessment for students with significant disabilities- testing window 3/28 through 5/20) Update - Staff are completing required student-specific components, such as first contact surveys and personal needs profiles. These individualized components are completed so that the assessment is individualized to meet each students specific needs/level. Staff are meeting to complete required additional training on February 9 for test administrators.
- New forms for state assessment were released Feb. 2 by DPI for the new FORWARD Exam. The district will be following the state's lead on how to incorporate those forms into current IEPs for the upcoming spring FORWARD exam state assessment.
- Rtl Committee has continued to move forward in updating the Rtl
  Handbook and protocols/procedures. Forms for the ABC Team (universal
  tracker, referral form, initial meeting, follow-up meeting, and
  accommodations/modifications sheet) are complete and ready to be
  implemented. Building principals indicated they would be presenting the
