District News



Foreign Language Opportunities

The Palmyra-Eagle Area School District has recently made great strides in the district's foreign language opportunities. Three years ago, the district offered only Spanish and French in levels I-IV for high school students. The program has now grown to offer both Spanish and French at grades 7 and 8. The middle school students receive 1 guarter of Spanish and 1 guarter of French each year to give them exposure and a little background knowledge with languages. This helps them to make an informed decision about what they would like to take in high school, which is important for our college bound students especially: most Wisconsin Universities "highly recommend" 2-3 consecutive years of a foreign language for entry. In the near future, the district hopes to offer AP level French and Spanish, as our program continues to grow, and as our students continue to develop their capacity.

The Palmyra-Eagle Middle/High School World Languages Mission Statement is, "To educate, equip, and inspire our students to communicate effectively, and to become contributing members of a global society." The foreign language classes are skills-based where students are graded on

their ability to use their language skills to interpret oral and written resources, engage in formal and informal oral discourse, and produce formal and informal written products. These skills are clearly communicated to students, and



units of instruction are carefully planned to prepare students to reach and exceed these benchmarks. Through developing high quality skills-based summative assessments, planning formative activities to prepare students, and through scaffolding student progress via frequent, high-quality descriptive feedback and interventions along the way, our students are able to apply their skills to analyze authentic resources, speak formally and informally in the target language, and produce polished written products in Spanish and French. Lastly, starting this year, students in level IV classes will receive an "exit" interview to include a "Modified Oral Proficiency Assessment" to determine their actual proficiency level in the area of interpersonal conversation. This will gauge how well a student can transfer his/her skills that were learned and assessed in the program, to an impromptu, real-life situation.

Students involved in the foreign language at the high school level are offered an affordable chance to partake in global immersion field trips. This summer, ten students in the Spanish program will be traveling to Peru for nine days. A group of students in the French program will be traveling to France over summer break as well. These opportunities are offered at an affordable rate and provide educational and memorable experiences for the students.

Engaging Opportunities

In the Palmyra-Eagle Area School District, our focus is "to ensure students excel with intellect and virtue, inspired by innovative educators who engage and challenge each individual." Daily evidence of adhering to this philosophy is available in each school within our district as we strive to provide opportunities for the development of the whole child.

In order to best meet student needs, time is set aside during the school day for enrichment and/or intervention time to extend/reinforce learning. In our middle & high schools, this is referred to as resource time, at Palmyra Elementary it is PAW time and at Eagle Elementary it is IE time (Intervention/Enrichment). The premise is the same throughout the buildings. Students who need extra help in the areas of reading, language arts, math, and or science work in small groups with highly qualified educators to extend and reinforce skills. Other students during this time may have the opportunity to complete assignments in guided study halls or to take part in an enrichment activity. Student groupings are fluid (changing every few months) allowing students to try new opportunities or to get the extra help they need. Some of the enrichment opportunities throughout the school day include Lego robotics, jazz band, photography, special choirs, band, coding and other computer activities, STEM activities, and Math 24 practice.


Outside of the school day, opportunities abound for students in the Palmyra-Eagle Area School District. Math 24

District elementary students in grades 4th-6th have an opportunity to participate in Math 24. Math 24 is a unique mathematics teaching tool that teaches children the relationship between numbers through a game. The game progresses from single-digit equations to double-digits, then integers and beyond. The Palmyra-Eagle Area School District participates in annual grade-level competitions with the Whitewater TAG Network which includes schools such as: Waterloo, Whitewater, Edgerton, Clinton, Jefferson and Beloit Turner. The district dominated the competitions this year, with Alexis Wangard winning the 6th grade Championship, Lauren McGlothlen earning the Championship in 4th grade and 5th grader Lainey Fredrick earning 3rd place in the 5th grade competition. Multiple

other district students earned top 5 finishes, demonstrating marked proficiency in this field.



STEAM

STEAM learning, an educational approach which utilizes Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics as access points for guiding student dialogue and critical thinking, is found daily within our district. Events such as the Eagle Elementary STEAM afternoon and the Palmyra



Elementary Science Fair showcase this ideology. At the STEAM afternoon, students chose to participate in a variety of hands-on learning stations such as: Marble Madness, Cardboard Arcade Challenge, Fundlandia

(LEGO Amusement Park), Sew Sew Cool (pillowcases made were donated to Children's Hospital), Nerdy Derby, Zip-line Race, Float the Boat, Mystery Maker Bags & Leaning Tower. These activities allowed students to



experience what it felt like to be an engineer, designer, architect, inventor, and much more. Each station was taught by an EES teacher as well as engineers from Generac Power Systems, Inc. At the Palmyra Elementary Science Fair, students shared their scientific findings after researching and testing a variety of interesting topics, such as: solar ovens, potato clocks. freezing rocks, homemade crystals, air pressure & marshmallows and much more.

Track & Field Fun

The 5th & 6th graders at both Eagle & Palmyra Elementary schools had a fun bonding experience at a Track & Field meet held at the high school on Tuesday, May 16th. They participated in a variety of events: softball throw, Frisbee throw, long jump, relay races, short distance runs, and more. Palmyra-Eagle High School track & field athletes helped run the event alongside organizers Mrs. Engh. Mr. Hauser and Mr. Valdovinos.

It was a great way for the students to get to know each other and to get acclimated to the building and the sport of track & field.





Art & Music Festivals

Eagle and Palmyra Elementary schools held their annual "Art & Music Festivals" this spring. At both events, small groups of band students performed a variety of tunes. The hallways in both buildings were decorated with student artwork that had been compiled throughout the year. Attendees were treated to root beer floats compliments of the Eagle PTO and Palmyra Home & School. The events are a wonderful culmination of the



variety of artistic opportunities available to our elementary students.

Battle of the Books is a reading incentive program designed to encourage students to read quality books and have fun competing with peers. Both elementary schools in the district provide an opportunity to participate in the activity. Teams are comprised of students in grades 3-6 and are guided by teachers and reading specialists. Each team receives a list of books and the group assigns several titles to each student. Team members are then expected to read their own selections and be able to answer questions relative to each. In Palmyra-Eagle, the teams meet on a regular basis at their individual schools and prepare for a competition between Palmyra Elementary and Eagle Elementary at the end of the year. At the meeting, the teams are asked to identify the book selections and authors after being asked questions by a facilitator. The teams then earn points for each correct answer. This year's meeting took place on Wednesday, May 31st, where the battle was neck and neck. Eagle took the first round, the second round ended in a tie and final round came down to the last guestion with Eagle Elementary pulling out the narrow victory. The students in the audience enjoyed the excitement are eager to join next year.


Panther Prom

school students. They are able to familiarize themselves with the building, meet teachers, enjoy lunch, acclimate themselves with the environment and hopefully ease some nerves.


