Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

Eagle Elementary students in Grades 3-6 will be participating in the Forward Exam this spring. Our school is scheduled to take the exam April 16th-20th.

The Forward Exam tests students in the areas of English Language Arts and Mathematics. Fourth grade students will additionally be tested in the areas of Science and Social Studies. One or more subtests may be administered daily during the identified time frame and it is very important that your son or daughter be in school during this time. Students not in school on the scheduled testing days will be scheduled for a makeup test prior to the close of the testing window.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

A portion of the day for the next two weeks will be used preparing our 3-6th grade students for the Forward Exam. There are resources on the DPI website that we used that align with the actual Forward Exam. We are reviewing material they have learned and we are teaching them about the tools they can use when taking the test as well as teaching them test taking strategies. The testing window is April 16-20 with makeups taking place the following week.

PAW - This is our third and final PAW session. Our teachers are working on individual student enrichment, intervention and differentiated instruction within classrooms to elevate student learning even more. The focus is in math and reading and 30 minutes each day is used for this purpose. We are very proud of the results we are getting during this PAW time and attribute a lot of student achievement to this process.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

We are started the next phase in the trial of the behavior matrix. For 3rd quarter teacher did one class and we worked on the process and procedures of reporting behaviors using a Google form. For 4th quarter we plan to trial with all classes. This will give the teachers a chance to do the reporting for all students still in a trial period. Communication will be coming home to students and parents explaining the behavior matrix and the purpose behind it. We plan to report the scores home to parents for 4th quarter, but still as part of the trial.

Forward and ACT Aspire testing will take place in April and early May. These test will involved 7th - 10th graders are various dates and times. Information will come home to parents to encourage their students to put forth their full effort and get a good night's rest the day before. In addition we surveyed the 6th, 7th and 8th graders and will be putting a reward in place for the Forward Exam results.

We are continuing to work on the format of 9th hour next year. We are looking at a program called FlexiSCHED that will help with moving students around 9th hour for support, enrichment or to make up test and quizzes. This will help with the logistics of running a flexible period where each individual student can get what they need. I plan to present to the staff at the April inservice on the logistics of how 9th hour will work.

- Special education staff will be administering the DLM (Dynamic Learning Map) alternative assessment for students with significant disabilities through the month of April. This is individually administered and time extensive. Thank you to those staff members, Beth Friemel and Jen Landherr.
- Special education materials including any curriculum/books or therapy items have been reviewed for need and purchased.
- All English Learner budget items have been purchased. Included in this were levels books in English and Spanish, notebooks, workbook items, and backpacks. The backpacks are currently being “packed” for elementary students who are English Learners to take home over the summer to continue to read by themselves and with their parents. The books and activities provided in the backpacks are one of the ways we are looking to increase family engagement with our English Learners.
