1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

SAEBERS/MYSAEBERS. The SAEBRS (Social, Academic, and Emotional Behavior Risk Screener) is part of the FastBridge suite and is a tool for universal screening of student risk for social-emotional and behavioral problems. Our teachers screened their students and are in the process of analyzing the data and are identifying those students at risk. Part of the screener allows the students to self-assess their social, academic and emotional behavior. At this time we are in the process of familiarizing our teachers with the various reports that are available to help us evaluate student performance against local norms to give us valid information on each student

What I have found to be most valuable are the self assessments. Students answer questions in three area:

- Social are the students respectful, do they argue, do they cooperate with others?
- Emotional Are the students sad, worried, withdrawn?
- Academic Do the students feel they are prepared, interested and engaged?

This information gives us instant information about any student at risk emotionally or socially. We don't have to wait until something happens to find out a student is having difficulties with his or her emotions or social interactions.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

We are going to slide the focus of PLC meetings to instruction over the next few months. We will work to help teachers implement tier 1 instructional strategies in their classrooms. As part of this process, the teachers will be introduced to the Optimal Learning Environment model, which is part of the New Teacher Network that Tori Franz and Kathy Retzke have been attending. Teachers will work in pairs to do co-observations. The teachers will be able to use PLC time to have pre and post conference meetings and provide feedback to each other.
