1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

Grade Level Meetings - During the last week of school we will have a transition meeting with all grade level teams. We will discuss student transition information so the teachers are aware of who is going to be in their class next year, where each student is academically, and will share any other student needs or concerns.

Summer Reading Program - We have 26 students in Palmyra Elementary School that are participating in the Summer Reading Program this summer. These students will receive books, a reading log, and activities to do in response to their reading. Students will come to PES twice during the summer months to turn in old books and pick out new books. They will also get to see a staff member from PES and discuss what they have been reading with other students at the meetings each month. If students log their reading and turn in their minutes at the end of the summer, they will receive Scholastic Dollars to use at the Fall Book Fair. What a fun way to keep the reading up during the summer and earn some cash to use at the book fair for new books!

PES will also be sending home a “Stop the Summer Slide” packet with all family. This packet will have helpful reminders about how to support your student as a reader over the summer. Students will also receive an invitation to a Barnes & Noble Summer Reading Program and Half Price Books in their packet. The Barnes & Noble program gives kids an opportunity to get a free book if they read 8 books over the course of the summer. In this packet is the students login information to our Think Central so everyone can work on math games and their fluency work.

We also had 80 students sign up to receive a personalize math workbook. We create the books off the students needs in math. If they could use a challenge or a review. If english or spanish would be beneficial at home. We base the workbooks off our current curriculum that they are working on in school.

2019-2020 Schedules - Teacher schedules are ready to go for next year. Time will be spent over the summer making the necessary changes based on available faculty positions.

Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- RTI Committee will be creating a district wide guide to our levels of support and interventions available. The RTI Committee will meet in fall to finalize a draft of this document.
- The Department of Public Instruction notified PEASD of the RDA: PCSA (the Special Education self-assessment to ensure compliance) process for the 2019-2020 school year. This process formally starts July 1, 2019.

Professional Development

- SEL Committee had a great year providing professional development to staff on the SEL competencies. A survey to staff has been sent out to collect data on the professional development that took place this year and assist in creating a plan for next year.
- PEASD has opted in to complete the Indicator 14 post graduation student surveys. The survey sample will be of students who received Special Education services and graduated in 2018. This was not required by DPI this year, however for each completed survey the district will receive \$1,500. The survey will be completed over the summer. The training took place on June 3rd.
