1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

Many of the faculty and I have been involved in extensive FastBridge Training the past two weeks. FastBridge is an assessment we use to screen and progress monitor our students in math and reading. We use these results to place students into ability groups and for planning appropriate individual student interventions. This test replaces AIMSweb and MAP, and gives us additional individual academic information that we did not have before.

Through the efforts of many people the first day of school went very smoothly. The faculty and staff were very well prepared and the custodial staff had the rooms looking great. I visited all the classrooms the first day of school and each classroom was very friendly, caring and extremely understanding of the students being nervous to return to school.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

Inservice was a success with a lot of time put into explaining things for the upcoming school year. Teachers were able to attend small group sessions on Olweus, Equitable Multi-Level Systems of Supports, 9th hour/FlexiSched and Go Guardian. These small group settings allowed for teachers to ask questions and gain a better understanding of the information. Teachers also met as a full group to talk about information for the upcoming school year. They had a good balance of meetings and work time to get their classrooms ready to start school.

The plan for 9th hour study hall for high school will start on Monday, September 10th. During the first week of school students were trained in the program we will be utilizing to help with teacher and student access to extra academic support. Juniors and seniors were also informed about open campus procedures. This model will provide invaluable access to students and allow teachers time to meet during the school day. As we move forward with Learning for All and our standards based grading initiative this time is key in the success of the program.

2. News and Noteworthy

All staff members were in place to start the 2018-19 school year. We are very excited about the skill set and new ideas that new staff are bringing to their positions. We know they will provide our students a high quality educational experience.

Open house. 7th and 9th grade orientations were a big success. A lot of families attending the evening, got a chance to meet their teachers, walk their schedules and put things in the lockers. Open house helps ease the transition for new students to the district and to the middle or high school.

Thank you to Amanda Jones for the coordination and set up for the training in our new benchmark screener and progress monitoring tool Fast Bridge. In our first training be became clear that this program will be very user friendly and time effective for use at the middle and high school level.

School Board Report and Update School/Building – District-Wide Director of Special Education, Pupil and Learning Services Amanda Jones September 11, 2018

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- All interventionist staff, principals and myself received FastBridge webinar training Benchmark Screening in both Reading and Math. On September 13th, an additional training will be held on Progress Monitoring. The district Rtl team researched and determined at the end of last school year that we would be moving forward with FastBridge instead of Aimsweb 2.0, for a variety of reasons. To date, the trainings have been extremely beneficial and the new platform and capabilities have staff very excited to move forward. Additionally, FastBridge syncs with the EduClimber system every night, linking the data automatically making it easy and accessible. FastBridge will be the district's benchmarking screener three times per year for students in 4K through grade 10, with progress monitoring for students in need of tier 2 and 3 interventions.
- Future use of the Social/Emotional screener portion of FastBridge will be determined by the Social Emotional Committee, with training to follow.
- Intervention and multi-level systems of support at the Middle and High School levels have continued to grow in its systemic function as well as training for staff to develop and implement interventions at the tier 2 and 3 levels to meet each individual student's need. Nick Jones has led the middle/high school intervention team toward a common framework and support for all students.
- Continued professional development was provided for middle/high school staff during inservice around DPI's updated Framework for Equitable Multi-Level Systems of Support. There was a lot of great discussion around this new framework and how our various initiatives such as Learning for All, Academic and Career Planning, and Social Emotional Learning all fit into this framework. We will continue this work throughout the district in future professional development.
- Beth Herman, DPI Consultant for Social Emotional Learning, presented to all district staff (including paraprofessionals) to introduce Social Emotional Learning and the new Social Emotional Learning Competencies that were released last school year. We were fortunate to have Beth come and share her expertise with us here at PEASD. The Social Emotional

Committee is excited to continue to provide professional development opportunities for all staff throughout the course of the school year around this area. We will be focusing on the 'What' and 'Why' this school year, so as to build foundational knowledge around it and then branch out to further Tier 1, 2, and 3 implementation identification as we move toward the end of the year into next. The importance of Social Emotional Learning is directly tied to Equitable Multi-Level Systems of support for all students, as well as Learning for All.

2. News and Noteworthy

- Lisa Jensen (district nurse) and I have been working with our medicaid billing system to begin implementing documentation of Attendant Care Services for students who are Medicaid-eligible. Lisa and I have researched and trained on this with Kinney Systems and have introduced it to special education teachers and paraprofessionals. Continued professional development and implementation of this data collection and reporting system will take place throughout the school year. These reimbursable medicaid services are a way in which the district can recoup some of the cost of direct activities of daily living skills associated with servicing our students.
- Staff in need of refresher and full-day training for Nonviolent Crisis
 Intervention will be trained by November by our staff "NVCI Trainers".
 Thank you to Nick Jones, Matt Stich and John Knoot for your time in training our staff and remaining updated in your own professional NVCI training to be our district "trainers".
