1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

FastBridge Testing - We have just completed our FastBridge testing and have met with teachers to analyze the data and put students into appropriate groupings. Students now will be challenged at their ability level.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

We are approaching the end of first semester and high school final exams will be held on January 15, 16 and 17. These exams provide students and teachers an opportunity to wrap up a semester and to assess students' progress in classes. We also provide exam exemptions for students who meet attendance, tardy and discipline requirements. This semester less than 50 students did not meet these requirements. That means over 150 students have missed less than 40 hours of school this semester. This allows students to have a tremendous amount of face to face classroom time with their teachers which is truly how we help them to be successful.

Director of Special Education and Pupil Services - Beth Jones January 14, 2020

Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- The juniors will be taking the ACT early this spring. Students with a 504, Individual Education Plan (IEP), or ILP (Individual Learning Plan) can apply for testing accommodations on the ACT that they normally receive during the school year. All ACT accommodations have been submitted to ACT. Approvals or denials from ACT for those requests have not been received.
- RDA PCSA update: Student level corrections have been made and verified with DPI. Individual groups of teachers have volunteered their time to work on creating systems and supports to ensure continued compliance when writing IEPs. These items include but are not limited to a department handbook, checklists, and bullet point reminders.
- ACCESS testing is almost completed with students in our EL program. The testing window closes at the end of the month.

Professional Development

- A small percentage of students in special education are on alternative state standards. The special education teachers who are the case manager for these students will be participating in a Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) training on January 13th. The DLM is an alternative state assessment for these students.
- The same group of special education teachers will be going through follow-up training on January 22nd of the Unique Learning System curriculum and resources. This curriculum directly aligns with the alternative state standards.

• Bridging Brighter Smiles provided services to students in both elementary students in December and will be back in January for students at the middle and high school. About 30 students are participating in the program district wide.
