Starting April 27th, and for the remainder of the school year, we are teaching new material. Students will again receive educational materials as we have done the past few weeks, but a weekly schedule will also be designed by teachers that will outline specifically what material will be taught, and what the student expectations are for that week. This will include a weekly video message and a Friday virtual whole group student/family check-in meeting. Due to the fact that at-home learning preparation requires an increased amount of planning and is outside of our normal routine for our teaching staff, every Monday will be reserved for teachers to prepare lessons, scheduled assigned work, and prepare for the upcoming week of at-home learning. Teachers will continue communicating with parents to explain weekly expectations.

Parents were able to pick up their children's materials on Monday, April 27th from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. We extended the use of Chromebooks to second-grade students as well. Chromebooks for second-grade students were made available during this pick-up time.

Every child in the school received a tee shirt and many children received instructional materials or locker belongings during the pickup. Belongings and materials varied by grade level. Pick up was done outside the main entrance. No students or family members were allowed to enter the building because Eagle Elementary cleaning staff have been working tirelessly to disinfect the entire school.
