Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- RDA PCSA update: We are currently completing Step 1 and finalizing an Ad Hoc Committee. Within the next few weeks the Committee will meet to discuss a plan for reviewing the documents and moving into Step 2 of the process.
- The SEL team has met and started to plan out professional development and supports for staff to use with students for the upcoming school year.
