GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

Registration will open March 14 and close at the end of the day on April 29. Please complete the appropriate summer school registration forms and return them to your school office or mail to Joel Tortomasi, Summer School Administrator, at Palmyra-Eagle Area School District: itortomasi@peasd.org

You will receive a summer school course registration letter from the Palmyra Eagle Area School District prior to the start of summer school. Schedule your child by their CURRENT grade level. Current 4K and 5K students may sign up for "Growing into Kindergarten" programming. Information on "Growing into Kindergarten" is located at the end of this booklet.

Payment for course fees must accompany registration forms. Space will not be reserved for your child without payment.

TRANSPORTATION

There will be no transportation for students who live in the Eagle Elementary School area. Students who live in Palmyra may take a shuttle bus from Palmyra-Eagle Middle/High School to Eagle Elementary. The shuttle will begin boarding at 7:30 am and depart for Eagle Elementary at 7:40 am. Students will board the shuttle to return to the Middle/High School at 11:55 am, with arrival at 12:15 pm. There will be no adult supervision at the shuttle stop and parents should remain at the shuttle stop if their child is unable to wait on his/her own. Parents may always elect to drop off their child at Eagle Elementary directly.

ATTENDANCE

Due to the short duration of the summer school program, attendance at all classes is very important. Students are expected to attend on a regular basis. If you have a vacation planned, however, your child may still register and attend summer school. If a student will be absent, please call the administrative assistant (262-594-2148 ext. 4450) following the same procedures at the academic school year.

COURSE FEES

Some courses charge a minimal fee to help cover the cost of materials and related items for the class. Payments are due with registration forms.

COURSE CANCELLATIONS

Classes without sufficient enrollment by April 30 will be canceled and fees will be refunded. Students will be placed into other class choices.

AFTER SCHOOL WRAP-AROUND CARE

Wrap-around care is available after summer school from 12:00-4:30. Care is provided at an affordable rate to support our school community and families. Please see the wrap-around care page in this packet for more information.

DRESS CODE

Students may wear casual dress during summer school. However, students must still dress appropriately for school. For safety reasons, students MUST WEAR SHOES (no flip flops) for all summer school sessions.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR AND DISCIPLINE

All students are expected to be safe, responsible, and respectful at all times and in all areas of summer school—both on and off school grounds. In the event that a student chooses a behavior that is not safe, respectful, or responsible,

the teachers/summer school administrator will attempt to address/reteach the appropriate behavior. If the behavior is repeated, presents a danger to self or others, or constitutes gross misconduct, the parent/guardian will be contacted and the student will be sent home. Students with repeated disciplinary issues may be removed from summer school.

SUPERVISION

The Palmyra-Eagle Area School District is responsible for the safe care and supervision of all students who are properly enrolled in the district's summer school program. Students with gaps in their schedules must be supervised by a parent or guardian and/or must leave the school building each day as soon as they finish their class(es). The school district's responsibility for safe care and supervision ends as soon as those students who enroll leave school property. No adult supervision shall be provided for shuttle drop off or pick up at the Palmyra Middle/High School.

NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

School Board policy (453) for the Palmyra-Eagle Area School District states that "medication will be administered by designated school personnel with appropriate written permission.
